

## CULTURAL TOURISM RESOURCES AND REFERENCES

Some useful research sites are listed below. If you have trouble opening any of them, just start with the key site. For example, if you can't open the James Cook University site, start by keying in just [www.library.jcu.edu.au](http://www.library.jcu.edu.au) then look for the tourism specific section.

### Tourism research
